## The Return of Hulme's Bridge Ferry



Many people throughout the Irlam area will know of the Hulme Ferry Service that runs from Boysnope Wharf over to the Davyhulme Millennium Nature Reserve in Flixton across the Manchester Ship Canal. Some

great news is that this Free ferry has now returned to service on a limited basis from Saturday June 11th. It will operate on **Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from 10:00am – 4:00pm plus Mondays in July and August**. A larger boat will be available on the weekend days with a normal six seater boat at other times. The operating schedule is being kept under review by the Ferry owners, The Manchester Ship Canal Company. Naturally it will be based on demand and it is hoped that as the word is spread around in all areas that the service will achieve the increased use and popularity that it has enjoyed in past years.

### How do you find the ferry?

On the Salford side there are footpaths leading to the landing stage from near to Boysnope Golf Course. The Salford Walking Route goes close by. Take time out to use this ferry.

They also met the landlord and landlady, Eileen and Seamus McCallion where many residents went on the morning of the explosion where they were publically thanked and also praised everyone for the community spirit that residents had shown.



## Camerata, Urban Symphony N05?

Urban Symphony is a year long project that has taken its inspiration from the architecture of Manchester unlocking the musical stories of the city.

Irlam and Cadishead Youth Project, working with artists Michiko Fujii and Jocelyn Arschavir, have created their response to the Undercroft – a dark and mysterious space hidden deep below in The Bridgewater Hall auditorium

Upon visiting the Undercroft, the group immediately noticed the contrast between this space and other parts of the building. The Undercroft provoked sensory and imaginary responses as the young people observed the contrast in light, sound, texture, temperature, surfaces and interiors to that of spaces upstairs. Thoughts of other worlds, science fiction, films, computer games and ghost stories were discussed and it was this rich imaginary response from the young people that Michiko and Jocelyn wanted to develop.

The Escapees, a undercroft-inspired installation was created back at the centre in Cadishead Hall, where the young people were able to compose and record their responses and produce a film that was shown at the Bridgewater Hall.

## Lords Street Kick about area

Salford City Council are proud to inform you that following on from requests from local children and user groups to provide somewhere for children and adults to play football, Lords Street kick about area has almost been completed

The scheme underwent a full consultation with the local community and the thoughts and aspirations of the people involved were considered when drawing up the scheme.

The kick about area consists of a macadam path leading to a hard standing base where line markings and goal panels at each end facilitate the playing of football and basket ball. The area is lit with ambient lighting and seating and bins provided.

Trees will be planted along Lords Street between the housing opposite and the scheme to enhance the area.

Local children have designed the sign and are keen to take ownership of the scheme.

## Amphitheatre on Prince's Park

Local performers in Irlam have something to cheer about with the completion of a new amphitheatre in Prince's Park. A natural bowl and stage have been built, with improved drainage and vehicle access so that local residents can benefit from year-round performances. The bowl improves the acoustics as well as giving audiences somewhere comfortable to sit and watch.

## Irlam and Cadishead Integrated Youth Support Services Detached Team

Irlam & Cadishead IYSS detached team have been busy working with groups of young people over the past few months. Activities provided have included Friday night and Saturday day football sessions. This has been in partnership with Manchester Utd Foundation

The Integrated Youth Support Service mobile bus offers activities including Wii, arts and crafts and flat screen TV. We have provided BBQs and other youth work activities on Prince's Park and also at Irlam and Cadishead Youth Centre.

## Do you know where your children are?



The Salford South Neighbourhood Policing team have become increasingly concerned over reports that groups of girls from the Irlam and Cadishead area are camping out overnight on rough ground alongside Cadishead Way. It is vital that the girls realise that they are putting themselves in danger as reports suggest that the girls are also drinking alcohol excessively.

It would be easy for others with criminal intent to locate the girls and either steal property from them whilst they are in a drunken stupor or commit more serious offences when they are incapable of defending themselves. There is also the obvious danger that because the girls are staying in poorly lit fields and on waste ground that they could come to harm if they fall or become injured far away from any houses. More recent reports suggest that some of the girls have also been camping out at the clay pits at Rixton with the obvious risks associated with this.

Parents should also be warned that many of the girls are lying to their parents by using the age old ploy of saying that they are staying at each others houses. I would ask that all parents double check if your children say that they are staying at a friends house for the night.

## Stories of Chat Moss Heritage Lottery Funded Project launched

We have now appointed Oral Historian, Christine Gibbons and 7 artists from different disciplines who will be facilitating creative workshops over the next few months.

We delivered a successful training day at Irlam Council Offices for 12 volunteers. The training day was facilitated by The Oral History Society, who gave us an informal and practical introduction to Oral History. Working along side Christine the volunteers will be helping to gather research, to take oral histories of participants and to assist with putting together what will be a fantastic legacy of stories and images, for archives and potential publication or displays in the future.

These recordings and stories, as well as photographs, will be used by the creative practitioners who will be facilitating workshops within the seven schools, which will be taking place over the next few months, these are:

---

St Mary's Primary School who will be working with artist Jeni McConnell to create a portable museum and to develop a blog.

---

Cadishead Primary School is working with textile artist Jane Dennerly to create a large 3d wall hanging.

---

Fiddlers Lane Community primary are working with film artist Jenson Grant.

---

Irlam Endowed Primary is working with Mark Mennell to create an outdoor sculpture within the school grounds.

---

Moorfield Primary is working with Terry Caffrey on a creative writing project.

---

St Joseph's Primary is working with Nerissa Cargill Thompson focusing on puppetry and Irlam & Cadishead Community High School is working with artist Julie Mosley to create a textile piece.

---

The project will end with a celebration event for everyone who has participated in the project, and the production of a small book containing quotes, photographs and a selection of the creative work produced by the young people.
