

Ordsall Bowling Club new Pavilion



17 August 2010 was a very special day for Ordsall Veterans Bowling Club. It marked the opening of the new pavilion for a club formed in 1900.

The club's hut, which was their headquarters, was in a dilapidated state and it was difficult to recruit new players and encourage an active social life.

For a good many years they tried to influence the council to provide better accommodation but funding was always tight and there seemed little chance of any improvement.

Ken Atkinson, Treasurer, approached Ross Spanner, Neighbourhood Manager Ordsall & Langworthy. They joined forces with Councillor Alan Clague, Ward Councillor for Ordsall, George Gilbody and Jimmy Jones from the Environment Team. This team worked hard, with Councillor Alan Clague take a leading role.

The new pavilion was officially opened by Councillor Alan Clague on the 17 August.

The difference is unbelievable, the members are very proud of their new facilities and the atmosphere is so much better. Already we have recruited 3 new members and are hopeful of more. Anyone over 58 years old, learners or experienced, will be assured of a cordial reception. Our aim is to lay the foundations to ensure another 100 years future for the club.

The New Barracks Co-operative in Bloom

On Tuesday July 27th the Britain in Bloom Judges came round the Barracks Estate which has entered the Neighbourhood Awards section for the second year running. Last year it was awarded a Merit at its first attempt. This year our members have had to struggle to improve on last year because we have been going through a major refurbishment which has meant that the houses have undergone extensive work lasting for weeks.



In addition to showing the judges round, the Co-op took the opportunity of inviting the Mayor of Salford and the Lady Mayoress and others who have an involvement in the area of Ordsall where the Co-op is at work: these included Ross Spanner, Neighbourhood Manager and several officers from Salix Homes and the Contractors, Forrest. The Mayor and Mayoress took a real interest in the estate, which they had known many years ago and they shared memories with some of the Co-op's tenants, including Elaine Sands and Ron Crowther.

The visitors were shown around the estate to see the difference flowers – and vegetables – can make, as well as to look at the houses being given their Decent Homes Standard refurbishment and, in addition, a Green Retrofit through Salix Homes.

No need for queues, stress and anxiety – access our friendly health-related services at Primrose Hill:

Primrose Pregnancy Service:

If you think you might be pregnant and need to find out for sure, or if you have carried out your own test but want official confirmation or a second opinion, please just drop in to our Primrose Pregnancy Service.

There are 3 clinics every week, Mondays and Fridays, 8.30-10.00am, and Wednesday evening from 4.00-6.00pm. You don't need an appointment and will not have to wait – just drop in and meet in confidence with one of our trained and friendly team. You can have a test, and, whatever the outcome or your feelings about it, the worker will be supportive and refer you to the services you need. If the test is positive, our direct line to the midwifery service will secure you contact from the midwife within 3 working days. If the test is negative, but you wish to be pregnant, the midwife will still contact you within 7 working days for specialist advice. Every woman who has used this service has scored the service 9 or 10 out of 10 in their evaluation.

Baby Clinic:

Please note also, that we have a well baby clinic every Thursday morning, 9.30-10.30 am. There is no need for an appointment and usually no queue to see the Nursery Nurse from the Health Visiting Team. Just drop in and have your baby weighed, get specialist information and guidance, or discuss any concerns. You won't be rushed, and again you will receive a very supportive, friendly service. The clinic time means that you and your baby or toddler can stay on for Stay & Play in the Children's Centre if you like.

You will always receive a warm welcome at Primrose Hill.

Children in Ordsall will be learning how to stay safe as part of rugby coaching sessions involving police officers from Salford Central Neighbourhood Policing Team.
