Salford Community Safety Strategy Summary 2011-14



Our vision is for Salford to have a clean, green and safe environment

The **Salford Community Safety Strategy 2011-14** has been developed by the Salford Community Safety Partnership to help reduce crime and disorder in the city.

The aims of the strategy are to:

- Build safer, stronger, more confident communities.
- Increase community safety and reduce the fear of crime.

To achieve these aims, the partnership has identified **four key priorities** for the next three years:

1. **Helping all our communities feel safer.**
2. **Reducing crime.**
3. **Effectively tackling anti-social behaviour with the community.**
4. **Reducing the harm caused by drug and alcohol misuse.**



The Salford Community Safety Partnership is made up of public and private agencies such as Salford City Council, Greater Manchester Police, Salford Probation Service, Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue, NHS Salford and the Greater Manchester Police Authority

What we have achieved

Since 2008, Salford has seen a:

- 42% drop in serious acquisitive crime (e.g. robbery, vehicle crime).
- 20% drop in serious violent crime.
- 23% drop in domestic burglary.
- 50% drop in vehicle crime.
- 47% drop in criminal damage.
- 34% drop in assault with injury.
- 18% drop in fly-tipping.

We have also continued to work closely with the community to organise a number of successful SNAP events — to clean up areas and target criminal activity over a week of action.

1 Helping all our communities feel safer

We will achieve this by:

- ➔ Supporting and protecting victims and witnesses of crime.
- ➔ Improving the quality of the local environment.
- ➔ Protecting vulnerable people and locations.
- ➔ Targeting gangs and serious organised crime groups.
- ➔ Improving the safety of public transport.
- ➔ Providing information to residents about how we are performing.
- ➔ Providing support to victims of hate crime.

2 Reducing crime

We will achieve this by:

- ➔ Targeting robbery, burglary, vehicle crime and violent crime.
- ➔ Promoting restorative justice such as community service across the city.
- ➔ Targeting frequent offenders of crime.
- ➔ Reducing incidents of domestic abuse.
- ➔ Reducing crime against Salford businesses.
- ➔ Reducing crime against schools and other public buildings.

3 Effectively tackling anti-social behaviour with the community

We will achieve this by:

- ➔ Taking action against individuals and groups behaving anti-socially.
- ➔ Carrying out Sustainable Neighbourhood Action Projects (SNAP's) and seasonal campaigns.
- ➔ Targeting offenders of environmental crime such as fly-tipping and graffiti.
- ➔ Seizing nuisance off-road vehicles.
- ➔ Providing positive activities for young people.
- ➔ Carrying out activities to reduce incidents of arson.

4 Reducing the harm caused by drug and alcohol misuse

We will achieve this by:

- ➔ Reducing drug related offending.
- ➔ Targeting premises that are being used for drug use, supply or production.
- ➔ Involving young people in seeking alternative activities to drinking alcohol.
- ➔ Carrying out test purchasing to detect the sale of alcohol to under 18s.
- ➔ Reducing alcohol related crime.

How to get involved

Everyone who lives and works in Salford can contribute to making our communities a safer place by:

- Getting involved with your community committee.
- Getting involved with local community projects such as the 'Friends of Parks' projects and neighbourhood watch schemes.
- Getting to know and working with the neighbourhood police teams including the local beat officer and police community support officers.
- Reporting crime to your local police or through the anonymous Crime Stoppers number and supporting police and partners in investigations.
- Getting involved in local voluntary work such as organising positive activities for young people.
