### How to find us:

The Hall is near to Salford Quays and is signposted from most major roads in the area.

### By bus:

Bus route numbers 71, 73, 84 and 92 stop on Ordsall Lane. Any bus to Salford Quays stops on Trafford Road (about 200 yards away).

### By Metrolink:

Exchange Quay Metrolink Station (on the Eccles Line) is just a 200 yards from the Hall.

### By train:

The Hall is 1.5 miles from Deansgate Station and 1.7 miles from Salford Crescent Station.

Ordsall Hall has been brought back to life – come and find out how it has changed.



**Ordsall Hall – Salford’s Grade I listed Tudor manor house – was first recorded in 1210. Since then, it has been home to medieval gentry, Tudor nobility, Catholics loyal to the crown, butchers, farmers, an Earl, an artist, priests, scout troops, mill workers, cows and several ghosts!**

A major restoration of the building from 2009–2011 means that on a visit to the Hall you can:

- Wander back through time and soak up the atmosphere in our re-created room settings.
- Discover the story of the Hall and the people who lived here in our hands-on family friendly exhibitions.
- Find out what was cooked in a Tudor kitchen.
- Explore and enjoy nationally significant features.
- Relax in the beautifully landscaped gardens.
- Enjoy a coffee in our new refreshment area.
