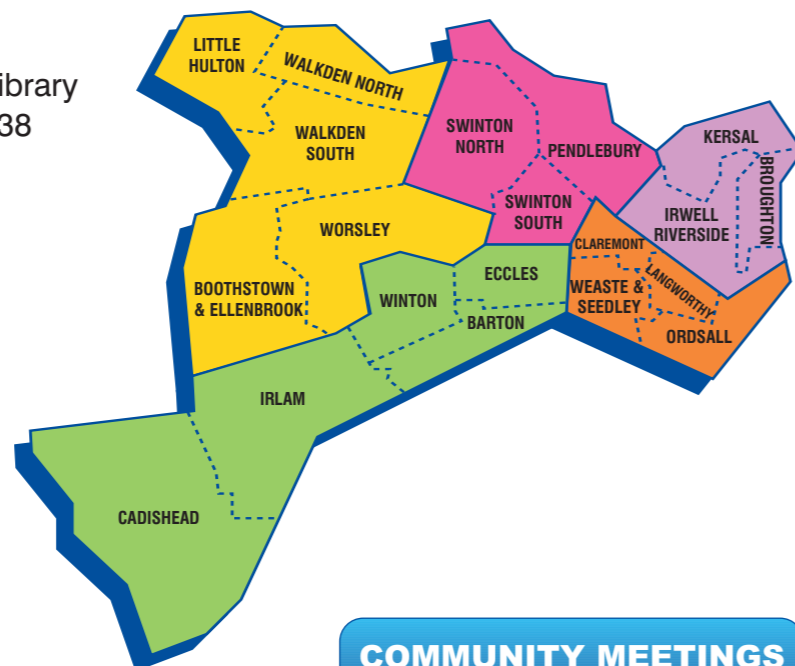

### ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR DOWN TO AN ALL TIME LOW

Antisocial behaviour is at an all time low in Salford.

There were 976 recorded incidents in August and 887 in September 2010 compared to 1,689 and 1,407 for August and September last year across the city. That is a reduction of 42% and 37% respectively.

In central Salford, there were 210 and 187 incidents recorded in August and September this year compared to 398 and 318 in the same months in 2009. This amounts to a huge 47% and 41% reduction respectively.

Various tactics are being used by

police and partner to reduce antisocial behaviour including patrolling hotspot areas, dispersing large groups of young people and advising them of alternative activities they can participate in.

Chief Superintendent Kevin Mulligan from Greater Manchester Police's Salford Division said: "I am pleased to see there has been a drastic reduction in antisocial behaviour and there is a year on year decrease in incidents taking place. However, despite Salford being a safer city to live and work in, we are dedicated to reducing the number even further.

## BURGLAR BROKEN TV IS REPLACED

People living at a care home in Salford will be able to watch their favourite television programmes again after an attempted burglary left their TV broken.

Residents of Queen Alexandra Close in Ordsall were devastated when a burglar tried to steal their TV and dropped it when he was disturbed. Members of the Salford Central Neighbourhood Team visit the home on a regular basis to discuss policing issues and were determined to try and help. PCSO Danny McNicholas helped raise awareness of the story and thanks to a kind hearted donation from a member of the community, they can now watch programmes on a new 50-inch plasma screen.

Sergeant Stuart McGuire from Salford Central Neighbourhood Policing Team said: "The television plays a big part in the resident's social lives at the care home so they were naturally upset when they found it was broken. This generous donation proves that community spirit is very much alive and well even in

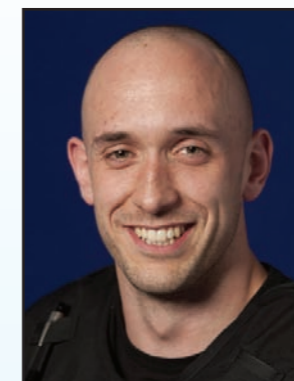

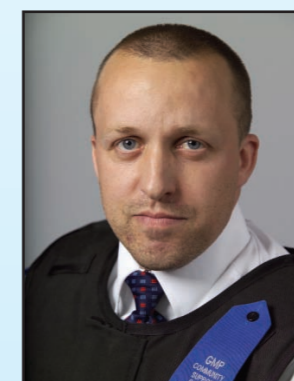
