COMMUNITY MEETINGS PROVE A SUCCESS

Priorities that residents in Salford have set at a Beat meeting, has led to an off-road bike being seized and taken off the streets.

Residents in the Winton area decided one of their major concerns was off-road biking and wanted police to tackle the problem.

Since the meeting, officers from Salford South Neighbourhood Policing Team spotted a youth riding a bike whilst on patrol. They seized the vehicle, advised the youth of the dangers and advised their parents they could be in breach of tenancy with their housing trust by keeping the bike.

Sergeant Tom Martin from Salford South Neighbourhood Policing Team said: "Residents in Winton recently told us that off-road bikes were causing them concern and they wanted us to deal with the problem. As well as being a nuisance to the community, these bikes can also be of danger to the rider."

"The meetings have been well attended by residents in the local area and I urge those wanting to come to future events to do so. It is an ideal opportunity for the community to tell us how they want their neighbourhood policed, for them to pick out the priorities they feel we should be concentrating on."

KEEP OUT BURGLARS THIS WINTER

Police are reminding residents to leave their lights on and help prevent them being burgled this winter.

People need to be particularly on their guard at this time of year as dark afternoons and evenings can provide extra cover for criminals seeking out empty homes to target. Leaving a light on can keep burglars guessing on whether your home is occupied and encourage them to give it a wide berth.



Leave lights on when your house is empty, it gives the impression someone is home

Recent research involving interviews with convicted burglars supports this simple tactic as an effective deterrent to thieves. It is also cheap and environmentally friendly as leaving a low-energy lightbulb on mid- afternoon to late evening when you are out can cost less than a penny a day.

Superintendent David Wilkinson said: "The winter months can lead to an increase in burglaries as thieves use the cover of darkness to target empty homes when people go out for the evening.

"Leaving a light on, using timer switches, setting your burglar alarm and shutting and locking all doors and windows could save you coming home to a nasty shock."

Officers are also reminding residents to remove all Christmas presents from their vehicles when shopping, dispose of empty boxes at the tip, not leave them in wheelie bins and if defrosting a car, wait with it, don't go back inside the house.
