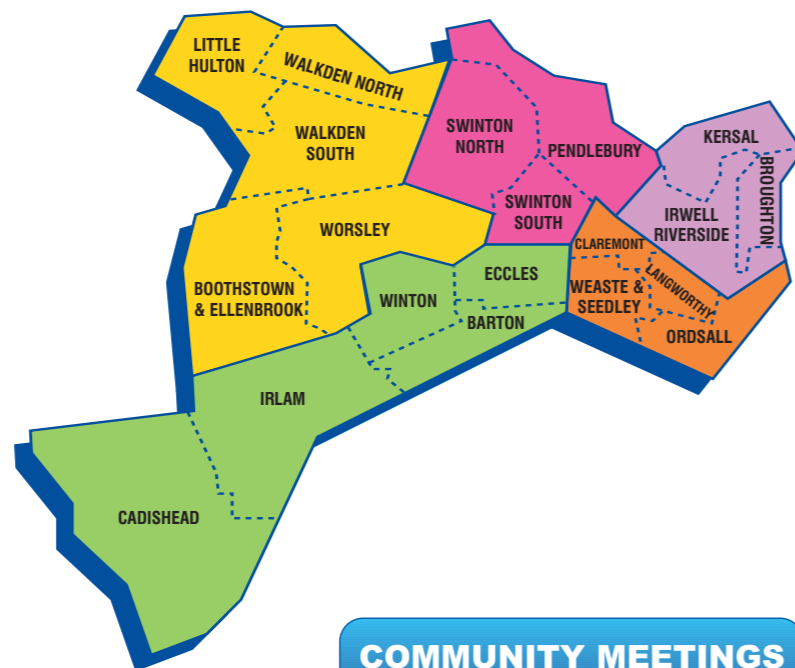

## POLICE AND PUB WORK TOGETHER TO REDUCE CRIME

Police in Salford are working alongside a local public house to help reduce crimes on the premises.

Previously, The John Gilbert in Worsley has seen incidents of alcohol associated violence and thefts. Following a hearing before Salford Council's licensing sub committee the pub will now close at 11.30pm every day.

PC Steve Allanson licensing officer for Salford Division said: "The pub was suffering at the hands of those who were determined to ruin other people's night out and the late licence the pub had may have contributed to this. However the owners have

been more than willing to work with us to try and eradicate the issue and have agreed to close earlier from Monday to Sunday."

Meanwhile pubs across the city have agreed to use plastic glasses during televised sporting events or other events that attracts a lot of interest.

PC Allanson said: "Plastic glasses are safer and are less likely to cause injury to members of the public. We initially piloted the scheme during this year's World Cup and it was a success. Thanks to funding by colleagues across Salford, plastic glasses will now be used on a more regular basis."

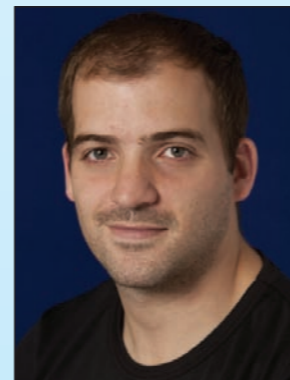
