Deal for new Academy build signed

The deal to deliver a new specialist media Academy at Salford Quays has been signed. Salford's Building Schools for the Future (BSF) partners reached 'financial close' on the new Oasis Academy MediaCityUK to replace the current Eccles Old Road campus. Its location will link pupils to facilities at MediaCityUK where the BBC is relocating its major departments.

Designs for the new Academy show modern teaching spaces, a large atrium for assemblies and presentations, dance and drama workshops, a media zone with radio and TV studios and a sports and performance hall.

Building work on the new Salford Quays Academy has now started.

Leader of Salford City Council, Cllr John Merry said: "This is another milestone for our Building Schools for the Future programme and we're working hard to ensure we progress as much of our plans as possible.

"These new 21st century buildings and their facilities will give pupils a head start in life by giving them better schools in which to learn.

"This financial close is a formal signature which guarantees the delivery of the new Academy and I hope that we can celebrate occasions like this for more schools in the future."

Patrick Ottley-O'Connor, Principal of the Oasis Academy MediaCityUK said: "This isn't just an investment in bricks and mortar but in the wider community and its young people.

"We believe that the new Academy will be a place which will inspire young people in the area for generations to come."



Snakes, ladders and bingo!

Local people are getting together in Langworthy to tackle major health issues – but also having fun.

The Healthy Communities Collaborative (HCC) is a community action approach to address key local issues. At present, this involves raising people's awareness about two issues: the symptoms of cancer; and the risks of cardiovascular disease (heart disease and stroke). The aim is to encourage more people at risk to seek treatment earlier.

The difference is that local volunteers use fun ways to get the message across to other local people. These include giant snakes and ladders, hook a duck, and bowel bingo! We have also engaged people on Salford precinct – after his free health check, one man said, "Cheers, I'm defo going to see my doctor now!"

Volunteers Co-ordinator helping in Ordsall & Langworthy

The council's Neighbourhood Management team have created five new jobs through the Future Jobs Fund in Ordsall, Langworthy and Pendleton.

The Volunteer Co-ordinator posts will be based at and managed by Ordsall Community Café, Ordsall Community Arts, Seedley and Langworthy Trust, The Emmanuel Church and Rainbow Haven.

Sue Bowen who initiated the project said, 'I realised that a lot of groups had opportunities for volunteers but not the time to find people. I felt it would be a great idea to create the jobs through the Future Jobs Fund which has no cost to the organisations involved. Not only would the project be supporting people back into work but would be increasing the activity of the groups and getting more people involved in their community'

All of the organisations involved rely on volunteers for occasional activities e.g. leafleting, events and for more long term support e.g. management committee members, researchers, youth workers etc. They will be strengthened by offering support and training.

Sue added, 'We want all the volunteers and staff to have the best possible experience; this project will benefit the groups, the volunteers and create positive opportunities for people to gain meaningful employment.'

The network of groups involved will be supported by a volunteer bureau in the SALT shop on Langworthy Road and at Ordsall Café, where the opportunities will be advertised to local residents. It is estimated that the project could support up to 200 volunteering opportunities.

Crime down in Salford 2010

Latest crime figures for the last 12 months in Salford show a dramatic decrease of more than 12 per cent when compared to the previous year meaning 2,935 fewer people have fallen victim to criminals.

In central Salford, crime has gone down by 18 percent meaning 1168 fewer victims.

Chief Superintendent Kevin Mulligan Commander for Greater Manchester Police's Salford Division said:

"Crime is falling in Salford year on year and residents can be assured that we will continue to target criminals over the coming months to reduce the figure even more.

"Our latest neighbourhood survey shows that 82 percent of people agree that police and Salford City Council are dealing with anti-social behaviour and the crime issues that matter to them. This is leading to them feeling safer in their homes and communities and increasing their confidence in local officers. We will continue to work towards the Service Promise and ensure we provide a first class service to the law-abiding majority in Salford.

"These results have been achieved by the hard work and commitment of the police, partners and community."

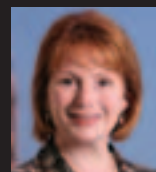
