How has Worsley and Boothstown Community Committee helped?

Our Community Committee priorities are outlined in our annual action plan. Over the last year we have helped local groups and allowed other to get new ideas off the ground. All these successful projects have benefited the whole community, recent examples are...

Ellenbrook Dell improvements

Funding was used to tidy up Ellenbrook Dell footpath and fencing which was identified as in need of improvement. Our Neighbourhood Management Team sought help from the Community Payback Team to carry out the work. Over four days a small team were able to bring very welcome improvements to everyone at Ellenbrook.



Worsley Road United Reform Church (URC) floor improvements

As a means of encouraging involvement in sporting activities, members of the Worsley Road URC applied for funding to help to cover the cost of new flooring to enable badminton sessions to start at the Church. Community Committee allocated some funding towards this and the Church has expressed thanks for support provided.

St Andrews School stage lighting

The stage lights at St Andrews School are fully functional and have been a real success. They are used by the dance club every week but have also been used with the Dance Festival that the school held at the end of the year which involved every single Key Stage 2 pupil. The school are very pleased with the improvements made.

In Bloom

Our whole community has conveyed its grateful thanks to everyone involved in our continuing 'in bloom' project. As with previous year, funding was allocated to In Bloom across Boothstown, Worsley, Moorside, Roe Green and Ellenbrook. Local volunteers worked hard to plant up and



bring colour to the area for all to enjoy, thanks to support from Community Committee and Salford City Council. St Andrews and Moorside schools also took part in the project this year.

Volunteer news

You may be aware as from October 2009 it will be mandatory for all groups working with young people to have Criminal Record Bureau checks. This includes groups such as brownies, guides and cubs. In terms of groups receiving Salford City Council grants, it is essential that CRB checks have taken place. Decisions will be made regarding funding based upon the information provided.

Burglars often try to use the darkness as cover to try and break into your homes but by taking a few simple steps, you can help deter them from stealing your property.

- Keep all doors and windows locked, even if you are staying in
- Use a timer with a light if you are going out. This will give the impression that someone is home
- If you are going away, ask a trusted neighbour to open and close curtains or blinds and check your house on a regular basis
- Always put your alarm on.

Treacle

Halloween and Bonfire night are upon us and it's highly likely you will get a knock on the door from either a vampire asking 'trick or treat' or hear fireworks outside.

This time of year can be a lot of fun for children and young people but it can also be distressing for residents. To ensure everyone has a safe and enjoyable time during the busy period, Treacle has been launched by Greater Manchester Fire Service, Greater Manchester Police, local authorities and key agencies. It is an initiative designed to tackle anti-social behaviour and reduce injuries caused by fireworks. It will also provide assurances to the public that such actions will not be tolerated. Top tips to ensure everyone has a safe and enjoyable time are:

- **Don't go alone** - trick or treating is more fun and safer if you go in a small group with friends and family.
- **Go with an adult** - get a responsible adult to go with your group to help if you have any problems.
- **Take extra care crossing roads** - more accidents happen to children in the dark.
- **Dress to be seen** - wear light, reflective clothes or carry a lamp or torch so that drivers and your responsible adult can see you.
- **Respect people's rights** - be polite, don't go out too late, ring or knock only once, and be prepared to take no for an answer.
- **Don't throw eggs, flour or fireworks** - it is classed as a criminal offence and you will be arrested.
- **Attend an organised fireworks display** - These are organized by professionals and minimize the risk of injury.

Authorised officers including PCSOs are now patrolling your area, and anybody seen not picking up after their dog will receive a £70 on the spot fine. Failure to pay this fine could lead to a court appearance and a fine up to £1000.
