## Singing with Dementia

**As an extension of the Forget Me Not Library project in The Resource Centre in Eccles, we are now into week 5 of our new venture "Singing with Dementia".**

Our aim is to use the music of yesteryear to unlock the brain and allow the person to respond to the rhythm and words of the music.

We use action songs that encourage movement and we are introducing instruments such as shakers, maracas, tambourines and tambourinas (which are similar to soft drums).

Even the slightest response in the quiet and withdrawn person is a huge success. We have seen this already within the group.

Several of our men have excellent and powerful voices and one 84 year old lady regularly gives solo performances. It is a very emotional experience to listen to and watch the transformation music brings to these people.

To be able to sing is not a requirement so just come along and join in the sessions.

## Caring in Clarendon and Weaste

There is insufficient support for carers in Clarendon and Weaste. During 2009-2010, Unlimited Potential, a local social enterprise, is working at the request of Salford City Council to address this.



At a Carers' Day in January, carers told us about their experiences. Carers identified two priorities:

1. Access to information and advice. Information and advice on sources of help, benefits, help with costs and appropriate services. Unlimited Potential is now supporting Salford Carers' Centre to develop GP practices as a gateway for carers.
2. Development of a group or network. The development of a carers' group or network in the area, together with a range of activities to provide support and empowerment. Unlimited Potential has been working with local carers and professionals to establish this. Any carer can now just drop in 12.00-3.00 p.m. any Wednesday at St. Luke's Church Hall on Liverpool Street in Weaste.

## Salford City Radio

**94.4FM Salford City Radio are celebrating after receiving news from the Government that they have been successful in their application for a significant power increase.**

The award winning community radio station, which broadcasts from Salford Civic Centre in Swinton has struggled to reach all areas of Salford in the past because the broadcast power they were given wasn't strong enough to reach all areas. From August, the radio stations signal will be boosted by 50% - meaning that the areas where the signal has been weak will be vastly improved.

94.4FM Salford City Radios Station Manager, Steve Suttie told us "this is fantastic news. For the past two years we have been appealing for this power increase because many areas such as

Clarendon and Weaste have had difficulty in listening to our celebrated community radio service. Our radio station is delivered by over 140 volunteers a week, and we broadcast programmes aimed

at all ages and interests, local news bulletins and what's on guides. As soon as our power is increased, we will be delighted to welcome thousands of new listeners to the service."

# Ordsall Hall renovations

**Ordsall Hall's restoration is progressing well. Underneath the scaffolding and huge tarpaulin, transformations are taking place in all areas of the building in preparation for its reopening in spring 2011.**

The fourteenth century roof beams have been uncovered and internal and external roof beams have been stripped of their Victorian coating to expose their natural oak colouring and patterns. In other areas carvings have been meticulously restored and conserved to reveal intricate details not seen for an age. New stairwells have been fitted, previously unseen rooms are being made accessible and medieval stained glass panels have been carefully restored to their former glory ready to take their place once again in the Hall. Outside, the Hall's ancient moat is being marked out, and trees and lavender hedges have been planted.

Whilst the Hall is closed for restoration staff and volunteers are working on lots of exciting projects inspired by the Hall and surrounding areas. We have been working with an artist and community groups to create ideas and stories for a unique textile hanging for the Great Hall. We are also working to capture photo portraits, stories and memories of people who live and work in and around Ordsall or grew up and went to school in the area. These will become part of a publication and exhibitions when the Hall reopens.

# Safer Homes in Claremont / Weaste

Following a meeting attended by Police, Claremont & Weaste neighbourhood team and Homewatch coordinators the Homewatch Coordinators Group was set up. A bid was submitted to the Home Office and we were awarded £49995 to make homes safer in the Claremont Weaste area. Not more than £130 could be spent on individual properties and the equipment was to prevent burglaries in the home by use of Security Lights, Spyholes, Intercoms, Window alarms etc. The main objectives were to make 370 homes in the area safer, to increase the membership of existing Homewatch schemes and to increase the numbers of Homewatch schemes.

Many different bodies contributed to the project including local police, Salix Homes, the Claremont Weaste Neighbourhood team from Salford City Council. Cooperative Group, Salford Royal Hospital, Help The Aged, Safe & Secure (UK) Ltd, Helping Hands, Homewatch Coordinators in Claremont and Weaste, Local Councillors, Salford City Radio and many individuals.

Over 640 Residences were made safer during the project including 2 blocks of sheltered accommodation, 3 residences for adults with mental health problems, 2 children's homes, 1 hostel and 5 blocks of flats. These groups were extremely pleased to receive help as they have found it difficult to improve their security. The number of Homewatch schemes rose from 43 to 71 during the lifetime of the project. A survey after the end of the project revealed that recipients of equipment were less worried about burglary after the project than before.

The project was very successful and all the money has been spent, but further funding has been allocated which will enable us to complete the outstanding requests.

## Summer Security

Officers from Greater Manchester Police's Salford Division are urging residents to keep their homes secure from opportunist thieves as summer approaches.

It can be tempting to leave a door or window open to cool down due to the increase in temperature but this acts as an invitation to thieves to steal your possessions.

A third of burglaries are down to insecurities and at this time of year, incidents can increase.

Fiona James, Crime Reduction Advisor for Salford Division, said: "I cannot stress how important it is that residents secure their doors and windows, especially during the summer months. We have had a number of incidents where thieves have gained access to homes because they haven't been locked and personal property has been stolen.

"My advice is to keep your home secure, whether you are going out or not. If you are leaving it unattended, use a timer alongside a light or radio to give the impression someone is home. If you are going on holiday, ask a trusted neighbour to check your property as well as open and close curtains in the morning and evening respectively."
