# Community Committee meeting

Matters arising at the Annual General Meeting of the Community Committee, held on 17th May, 2007.

Christine Hudson was elected as Chair of the Community Committee and Ann Cavanagh was elected as Deputy Chair.

Lita Sykes, Environmental Education Officer, introduced a DVD regarding environmental crime, which had been produced involving young people from the Irlam and Cadishead Youth Project. Simon Geggie explained his role as Environmental Crime Officer, which involves addressing the problem of fly tipping across the City.

Chief Supt. Mulligan gave a presentation with regard to the Safer Neighbourhoods Strategy, the purpose of which is to deliver a more accessible police service to the residents of Salford. A discussion followed in relation to issues of crime and disorder in the area.

Steve Jones, Development Officer in the Parks and Countryside Department, provided information in respect of the Cadishead Park Master Plan, the purpose of which is to guide development over a period of ten years, as and when funding becomes available. He outlined the key issues and the priorities in respect of the park, which had been identified during a series of consultation events that had taken place during the summer of 2006.

Richard Cohen, from the Customer and Support Services Directorate, and Andy Howitt, from the Community Health and Social Care Directorate, informed the Community Committee of details of plans for further improvements to be made to Fit City Irlam, which would include the addition of a fitness suite and a small outdoor 5-a-side area.

Other items included an update regarding the A57 Liverpool Road Corridor Project, details of budget applications made to the Community Committee and an Open Forum, during which local issues were raised.

# Boathouse Anglers Young Peoples Fishing Club



The Boathouse Anglers have recently formed a new junior section for young people from Irlam and Cadishead. The club have worked extremely hard over the past 12 months with assistance from the Neighbourhood Management Team, in particular SCL and the Ranger Service to get the club off the ground and actively involved in the Salford Inter Club Junior Angling League. The club is led by 3 coaches who are all part of the Senior section.

The club has grown from not having 1 single junior member to 13 young people who have signed up, and the enquiries to join are coming through on a weekly basis!

The club have secured £10,000 from Awards for All to develop the fishing pegs and provide coaching sessions and equipment for young people and an additional £1000 from Community Committee.

Bob Morris, a level 2 coach at the club, can't believe the response and the uptake of juniors. "Although it has been hard work, I have enjoyed working with the young people and passing on my skills and angling experience."

## The Irlam Rotary Corner

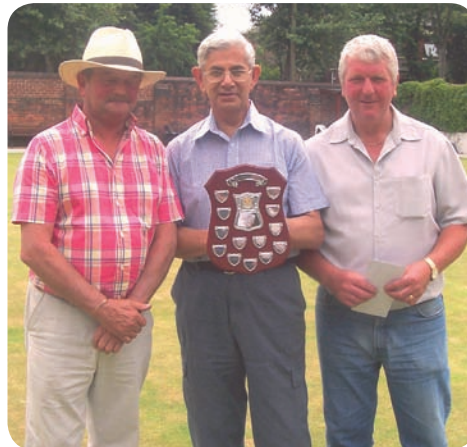

# Greater Manchester Police

We have had a busy time this year and have seen some good results. There has been a decrease in burglary, robbery and violent crime, but a slight increase in theft from motor vehicles, again targeting valuables left on display, eg sat nav systems. **PLEASE** remove items from view when leaving vehicles unattended.

We are continuing to run Operation Brocade on Friday and Saturday nights which brings increased resources to I&C to target anti-social behaviour. This has led to some reductions, but on occasions the problems move to new locations and we have to alter our tactics accordingly. We try to respond to information from the public in relation to new 'hot spots'.

Operation Etna continues to target licensed premises and address drunken or violent behaviour. This involves visits to licensed premises at peak times to provide reassurance to the staff and law abiding public and address issues of drunken behaviour.

At this time of year, as the good weather and light evenings arrive, we see an increase in burglary of domestic dwellings. This is due mainly of people leaving doors or windows open and giving opportunist thieves an easy target. Although, in an ideal world, we should be able to leave doors unlocked, unfortunately, there are those who will take advantage of any situation. Please use vigilance when outside in the garden, or enjoying a barbecue.

There are also despicable individuals who prey on the elderly members of our community. These are people who will trick their way into homes using a variety of pretences, eg posing as workmen from utilities who have come to check waster/gas etc. posing as social workers or police officers in plain clothes. **NEVER** let anyone into your home without asking them to produce their full identification or ask them to return later when you have had the opportunity

to contact their office to confirm they are genuine.

**ANY** genuine caller will understand this and not cause a problem keep the door shut until you are fully satisfied, or call a neighbour/family member to be present before you let them in.

We are working to re-establish Homewatch within your area, using local PCSO staff as the link with co-ordinators, this will, hopefully, provide a better service and allow first hand local knowledge to be exchanged within the community.

We have now got an establishment of 6 Community Support Officers based at Irlam who cover both wards. They are well established within the Community and fully aware of local issues and policing problems. They have now got increased powers such as issuing warnings and seizing motor bikes being used in an anti social manner, taking alcohol from individuals either too young or in breach of alcohol ban, issuing fixed penalty notices for disorder etc.

They are well established with other partner agencies and work together with them, to resolve neighbour nuisance, anti social behaviour and criminality. (Insp Jill Gorse)
