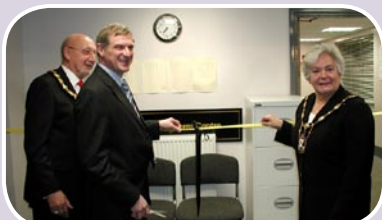

# Community Committee meeting

Matters arising at the meeting of the Community Committee held on 18th January, 2007.

Lynn Brown, Senior Youth Worker, gave a presentation on Youth Service Provision in Irlam and Cadishead.

Marcela Livingston, Community Artist, reported on the consultation process that had been undertaken with regard to the development of a design for the public art feature that is to be located at the roundabout on the Cadishead Way bypass, and presented images of the proposed design.

Mike Hall, Assistant Director (Resources), Children's Services, provided an update with regard to the refurbishment of Irlam and Cadishead Community High School, which is to commence in 2009 as part of the first phase of the Building Schools for the Future programme.

Paul Bland from Urban Vision gave a presentation with regard to the development of a 10-year strategy and action plan in respect of the Liverpool Road Corridor, which Urban Vision have been commissioned by the City Council to produce.

Ambreen Iqbal from Broughton Dat@base gave a presentation regarding community learning provision, which included a proposal for a training centre to be located in Cadishead.

Other items included (a) police issues, (b) budget applications made to the Community Committee, and (c) an Open Forum, during which a number of local issues were raised.

## The official opening of the Hamilton Davies Sixth Form Centre at I&C Community High School

Chairman of Governors, Eddie Waddell welcomed the guests, Deputy Mayor, Councillor Valerie Burgoyne and her consort Councillor Eric Burgoyne, Ian Stewart, M.P., Jane Bracewell from the Learning Skills Council, Jill Baker, Director of Children's Services with her Deputy, John Stephens and Terry Probert, President of the Rotary Club of Irlam. Mr. Waddell said that this has been made possible by the support of a committed and supportive governing body and commented on the number of former students who were present.

Neil McArthur officially opened the Hamilton Davies Sixth Form Centre. Mr. McArthur said that the Trust had been delighted to support the school in providing sixth form education. He particularly thanked the Rotary Club of Irlam for their support and cooperation with the project, the local authority for their vision and the Learning Skills Council for their confidence. He hoped that it would provide support for the aspirations of young people in Irlam and Cadishead.

Mr. Lamb said "We are delighted with the opening of the Hamilton Davies Sixth Form Centre. This is the culmination of years of hard work by many people striving to enhance the educational provision in our community. Students in the locality are now able to access education from early years through to further education in their own neighbourhood. 2006 has proved to be an excellent year with the school achieving high level GCSE results, attaining specialist school status in Business and Enterprise, Maths and Computing and receiving the first cohort of students into our Sixth Form. Our progress was recognised by Ofsted in October, who judged us to be a good school with an outstanding Key Stage 4 curriculum. We look forward to significant further development under the building schools for the future initiative to further enhance our learning environment."

From Friday 23rd February Irlam & Cadishead will have its second dispersal order and will run for 3 months.

Drawing on the success of the first order the second order will be used to target groups of youths causing problems in the area around Irlam Locks and Ferryhill Road.

When this order is in place youths in groups will be dispersed from this area and will be arrested if they fail to do so.

Antisocial behaviour has a significant impact on the quality of life enjoyed by residents.

Greater Manchester Police and Salford City Council take the complaints that have been received from residents of Irlam & Cadishead very seriously and the order is one of many ways in which they will be seeking to address the problems being caused in this location.

# Cadishead Park Master Plan

The Environment Directorate in partnership with Urban Vision is producing Master Plans for six parks within Salford. These Master Plans will guide the development of the six parks for the next ten years, with a long-term objective of each park obtaining District park status.

The master planning process for Cadishead Park began in May 2006. A stakeholder group consisting of local residents and officers of the Council was formed and a walk around the park was organised for June. Local residents, the Police and officers of the Council were able to identify issues important to the development of the Park.

The results of the walk-about formed the basis of draft proposals and the consultation process.

Information was placed on the council's web site to advertise the project and the forthcoming consultations.

The main consultation exercise was held outside Cadishead library on the 20th July and consisted of a display of the draft Master Plan and questionnaires for people to complete. Other events consisted of staffed displays at St. Mary's and Cadishead Primary Schools.

Additionally, displays and questionnaires were located at:-

- Cadishead library
- Cadishead Community Hall
- Fit City
- Irlam & Cadishead Community Committee meeting on the 20th July.

Completed questionnaires and feedback from stakeholders etc has led to the finalised Master Plan, which will be displayed at the above locations in the near future.
