# Community Committee meeting

Matters arising at the meeting of the Community Committee held on 19th July, 2007.

The agenda for the meeting included a wide variety of items.

Dave Norbury from Urban Vision provided information regarding the proposal for a new Neighbourhood Management Office to be built within the grounds of Irlam and Cadishead Community High School, to replace the current facility at Astley Road, as part of the Building Schools for the Future programme, and discussion took place regarding possible uses of the community space that was to be included within the building.

Nick Lowther from the Housing and Planning Directorate gave a presentation with regard to Chat Moss and discussion took place in relation to drainage issues and the long term future for agriculture on the land.

Maura Carey from the Chief Executive Directorate gave a presentation in respect of the Salford West Strategic Regeneration Framework and Action Plan and attendees were invited to complete a questionnaire which sought to identify the community's priorities for the area.

Other items included (a) the Highways Investment Programme 2007/08, (b) Community Action Plan/ Neighbourhood Management Update, (c) budget applications made to the Community Committee, and (d) an Open Forum, which provided an opportunity for local issues to be raised.

# Vehicle Crime

Throughout the month of October, Salford Community Safety Unit, in partnership with Greater Manchester Police, Neighbourhood Management and other agencies, are launching a big publicity campaign to strengthen the message of vehicle crime awareness and ways to reduce it.



## What can you do to help?

Take time to read available literature on keeping your vehicle and belongings safe and act upon it. By following a few simple steps we can all work together to eliminate the problem.

- Always park in approved car parks
- Always keep your vehicle locked, even if you only leave it for a few seconds
- Secure your vehicle with an immobiliser, alarm or tracking device
- Remove all items of property when you leave your vehicle, including Sat Navs, their mounting cradles and always remember to wipe away any sucker marks
- Consider leaving your glove compartment open to show thieves that it is empty
- Reduce the appeal to steal and property mark all your valuables and record their details free on [www.immobilise.com](http://www.immobilise.com)

## Irlam and Cadishead set to welcome the Sstar Networks

Community Health and Social Care and Bolton Salford and Trafford Mental Health Trust are pleased to announce the opening of their fifth satellite centre in Salford. The centre which is The Avila Centre attached to St Theresa's Church on Liverpool Road Irlam will officially open on Friday the 5th of October 2007 at 10.00am, and will run every Friday 10.00am to 2.30pm.

The Sstar networks (Salford Support Time and Recovery) is a relatively new and exciting initiative that has taken off in Salford, its premise is to provide a service for people experiencing mental health problems and is underpinned by The Recovery Model (<http://www.mhrecovery.com>)

The centre's aim will be to facilitate and support a range of community groups and networks addressing health and wellbeing. It will also focus on social, spiritual, cultural and economical potential of people who experience mental distress. The staff and volunteers will develop capacity within communities and support the development of self-help/support groups and networks. The staff and volunteers will also support individuals who self refer, through initial contact meetings. They will outreach into community engagement to promote social inclusion.

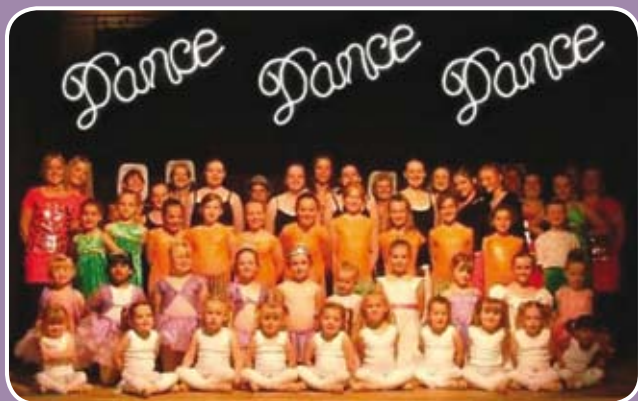

# I&C ANNUAL COMMUNITY FESTIVAL 2007

“The best event for many years” is just one of many comments the festival group have received since the annual festival on August Bank Holiday Monday.



Contrary to general belief, this is NOT a Council run event but is organised by a handful of local volunteers who have to work extremely hard each year at raising the necessary money, (£28K for this year), by applying to a number of funding organisations, as well as putting the event itself together. We do however work in partnership with the City Council’s Events Team and the community committee, whose help is invaluable in ‘making it happen’ on the day.

There were loads of things to do or see once again, including: pottery, willow weaving, woodturning, rural crafts and chainsaw sculpture demonstrations; displays by the Local History Society and the allotments group; a cookery demonstration and displays of tai chi and various dance styles in the Lifestyle marquees; a circus workshop and a range of hands-on craft activities for children; a birds of prey display and the usual range of fund-raising and information stands by local community groups, Salford City Council and partners. Two catering areas (one with mouth-watering home-made cakes) each had widely-differing musical accompaniment throughout the day. Entertainment was also provided by top calibre international street theatre artists.

The evening event was equally as successful, with an estimated 5000 people watching an amazing fire act by some of the best jugglers in the country, followed by the firework and pyrotechnical spectacular. Together with Silcock’s Fair, this was a very successful, entertaining and enjoyable day.





## Firework and Bonfire Show

The I&C Bonfire and Firework show will take place at Prince's Park, Irlam on Saturday 3 November 2007. The event includes a fairground, bonfire at 7:00pm and fireworks at 7:30pm. The event is free and part of Salford City Council's 'BIG Events in Salford' programme.

## Bonfire Night

As Bonfire Night approaches, home made bonfire sites create a risk to many residents across central Salford. Often started around waste land, these bonfires are too big or are built too close to buildings, power cables, roads and other street scenery. Doing so is extremely dangerous and each year Salford Fire & Rescue Service have to extinguish numerous fires that would otherwise cause a risk to public safety or health because of the danger they cause. They also become places that attract vermin such as rats, or where wildlife and pets hide, which can get killed or seriously injured.

These bonfires are classed as fly tipping and last year Salford City Council prosecuted a number of people who had dumped business waste on sites which they claimed were locations for a bonfire. Other people were identified on CCTV emptying domestic waste from their wheelie bins onto illegal bonfire sites. The council will prosecute anyone caught fly tipping waste, and an offender can be sent to prison for up to five years or fined up to £50,000 (unlimited if indicted to the Crown Court). Please report any fly tipping or illegal and dangerous bonfires. You can report it directly to Salford City Council on 0161 909 6500, following which the material will be removed.

Anti-social behaviour also increases at this time of year, especially with Trick or Treating. Whilst many of us enjoy the traditions of Halloween, please respect the wishes of others who do not wish to participate. Look out for elderly or vulnerable neighbours in your street as they may feel frightened or intimidated. If you are Trick or Treating remember to put your safety first.

To report anti-social behaviour of any kind, including firework misuse, harassment, loud or inappropriate behaviour or nuisance trick-or-treating, you can call the Respect Action Line on 0845 605 2222.

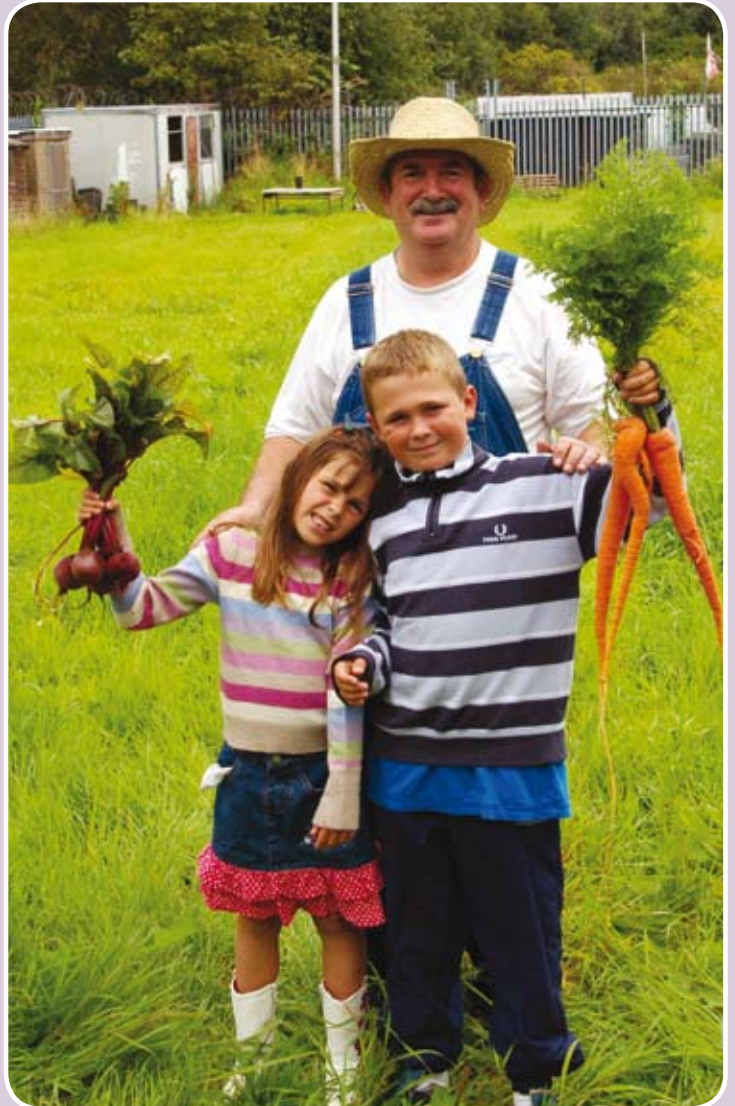
# Summer Events

## Respect Roadshow – Irlam

Salford is one of only 40 Respect Action Areas in England. As a Respect Action Area, all crime reduction partners in Salford are committed to going further to tackle the causes of anti-social behaviour and to intervene when anti-social behaviour does occur. As part of this commitment, senior representatives from Salford's Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership have been holding a Respect Roadshow, visiting communities across the city to hear about people's experiences and concerns about anti-social behaviour.

On 24th July the Roadshow came to Irlam where representatives from the police, children's services, New Prospect Housing, environment directorate and the community safety unit responded to a range of issues raised by an audience of local residents. Following the meeting a number of activities have been carried out including:

- Research into off road biking nuisance in Irlam so that resources can be directed to tackling the problem.
- Trafford District Council have been contacted regarding the off road biking problem and joint operations are being planned for Autumn.
- Leaflet drops have taken place in Cadishead to encourage residents to report off road biking nuisance.
- Individual complaints have been followed up and investigated by the neighbourhood policing team and the local NPHL housing team. Action plans have been developed to address the issues involved.
- Refresher training was provided for housing staff regarding the anti-social behaviour investigation process, evidence collation and the use of diary sheets.
- All live anti-social behaviour cases are being reviewed NPHL and the anti-social behaviour team.
- Trading Standards have continued to carry out test purchase operations at a number of off licenses in the area. Two premises have been found to have sold to young people and these licenses will be reviewed shortly.

Both Dave and Geoff have now moved to Swinton Police Station and are part of a unit targeting those who consistently commit crime in the Salford area. They have already had a significant impact.

Having worked with Dave and Geoff for many years I can say that they are among the best Community Police Officers I have ever worked with and I was very sorry to see them leave Irlam. I'm sure we all wish them every success in their future roles.

There are now three community Police Officers who have responsibility for the Irlam and Cadishead area, PC Vinny Taylor, PC Kevin Oakes and PC Tom Leyden. All three are very experienced officers and all have many years experience of working in the Irlam area. It was important when losing officers of the calibre of Dave and Geoff that we were able to replace them with experienced and highly motivated officers. I am delighted that we have been able to achieve this.

GMP is continuing to have a significant impact on the levels of crime. In the last financial year the level of overall crime has been reduced by 7.5%. This includes a reduction in burglaries of 14.1%, robberies down by 11.2%, violent crime reduced by 10% and vehicle crime reduced by 17.1%.

The new community team at Irlam including the Police Community Support Officers will continue to strive to see these figures reduced even further."
