

Children reunited with go-kart thanks to Police

Children from a school in Salford have been reunited with their stolen go-kart thanks to two Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs).

Pupils from St Joseph's Primary school in Ordsall were left heartbroken when callous thieves took the £600 go-kart back in November last year.

PCSOs Mark Gerrard and Danny McNicholas from Salford Central Neighbourhood Policing Team were patrolling Ordsall Park in April when they saw the vehicle being used by three youths. When approached, the youths fled.

PCSO Gerrard said: "When the go-kart originally went missing, the staff and children at St Joseph's were devastated. To see the look on their faces when PCSO McNicholas and I returned it was fantastic and I hope the pupils have many years of fun with the vehicle."

Digital Switchover and W4B

Digital Switchover is coming to our region in November and the Digital Switchover Helpscheme should be contacting eligible people in plenty of time about the help and support available to them.

If you are eligible the Helpscheme can:

- provide you with easy-to-use equipment that suits your needs
- help with installing equipment in your home
- fit a new dish or aerial, where we can, if it is needed to make the new equipment work
- give you an easy-to-understand demonstration of how everything works and there will be

someone you can call for help while you're getting used to things.

You may be eligible if you are aged 75 or over, or have lived in a care home for six months or more, or get (or could get) certain disability benefits, or are registered blind or partially sighted.

There is also a charity called W4B - **www.w4b.org.uk** which can provide a range of digital ready TVs and radios on long-term loan for older and disabled people.

Applications need to be supported by a referee - for example a charity, a recognised religious organisation, care worker, or personal assistant.

The project was funded by Positive Activities for Young People, William Sutton Housing and supported by Salford Youth Service, the Life Centre, Ordsall and Langworthy Neighbourhood Management Team and the Seedley and Langworthy Trust.

All the young people were individually rewarded for their involvement and received their very own Oscar.

Rachel and Cat, two local Langworthy residents said, 'We are proud to have been involved in the making of this film and loved working with the young people.'

Sue Bowen from Ordsall and Langworthy, Neighbourhood Management Team said, 'It was great to work with the group providing Friday night activities and giving the young people something positive to do. Ordsall Community Allotment Society

It is just over a year since a meeting was held at the Neighbourhood Office to find out if there were enough people interested in forming an Allotment Society.

We have since that time, formed the above Society, elected a committee of volunteers, made a constitution, opened a bank account, held meetings at the Community Cafe on average once a month, and various visits have been made to possible sites to realise our ambitions.

To date we are still awaiting confirmation of land for twenty half plots on the old playing field at St. Clements School. This is quite an achievement and it has been a rocky road, to get this far.

Understandably, the 30 odd names on our waiting list are getting impatient for a site to become available so that we can apply for funding to get the project up and running and to start growing produce.

As with all things time is not on our side and there is still a long way to go before the first seeds are planted.

However, soil samples have been taken to make sure it is safe and we are going to apply for lottery funding.

If anyone reading this is interested in getting involved, or any of those already on the waiting list can give an hour of their time it would be much appreciated. We need to 'dig' in for quite a long wait, but it will be worth it in the end. Once the site is up and running, lots of vegetables etc. will be growing in the area – we hope this will be sooner rather than later.

Retracing Salford

Most people have some photos at home, family snaps that they save in an album, maybe, or in a shoe box under the bed. Not many people take their photos, enlarge them to tabloid size, laminate them with plastic and then hang them from old plastic coat-hangers. But Lawrence Cassidy does. His new exhibition is full of them.

Residents of Seedley and Langworthy will be familiar with Lawrence's work. Last summer he moved in to the Langworthy Cornerstone. If you walked up the main staircase, you would have been confronted by human-size cardboard tubs from old mills in Salford. That's disconcerting, but what was worse was that each barrel had blown-up photos pasted to them, so that faces of Salford people from the 1950s stared back at you. Turning the corner, you would then see maps of the area from 1922 lining the walls, in between family snaps, all the way down the walls of the corridor to the Auditorium. It was an unsettling and inspiring show, one you had to look at closely to see each interesting detail. For instance, people had put pink spots on the maps, marking the house they used to live in years ago. Most of those houses, and, in fact, the whole streets, are gone now. It was a poignant feeling to know that.

That installation has only moved out recently, but meanwhile, Lawrence was busy working on a new show. He had negotiated space at the old United Reformed Church on Chapel Street. The building dates from 1819 and is directly opposite the newly refurbished Salford Central station. Most people recognise the twisting stone stairs to the old oak doors, even if they don't know the name of the place. Just recently, surprisingly, it has taken on a new use, as Lawrence has installed a photo display in the lobby. There's some familiar faces there, since the artist has re-used a few of his previous snaps that he has collected from families, but this time, they are enlarged, encapsulated, and hanging from coat-hangers rescued from Primark. A unique display, and only visible on one more Saturday in 2009. That's Heritage Weekend, 12 September. The show will be open 12 noon - 4pm.

There's more to come. Lawrence, ever restless, has a new plan. He wants to take his massive collection, which includes newly-donated pics from visitors to the latest show, and put them on the internet. His dream is to eventually have a complete range from A to Z of old Salford streets, with views of every demolished street and some snaps of families that lived on each one. Check out the website, he says, and watch it develop over the next few months. It will be well worth a visit.

Vehicle crime reduced by two thirds

Vehicle crime in parts of Central Salford has reduced by two thirds in the first three months of operation Blackfriars, aimed at clamping down on the problem. But residents and commuters are still being urged to take all valuables out of their vehicles.

Operation Blackfriars was launched in January this year and has involved high visibility patrols and crime reduction advice issued in three hotspots in the Blackfriars area. They are North George Street, Sherborne Street and Middlewood Street.

Since the beginning of January this year up until the end of March, there have been 11 incidents of vehicle crime in these areas, compared to 30 incidents in the same period in 2008.

Chief Inspector Vinny Greener of GMP's Salford division and lead on Blackfriars said: 'These figures are encouraging and prove that some vehicle owners who are parking in these areas are listening to our advice. However, the number is still too high and the members of the Blackfriars Partnership are determined to reduce the number further.

Thieves are always on the lookout for an easy target and by leaving valuables and personal possessions on show, we are making their job much simpler. It can be very distressing to find that your vehicle has been broken into and repairing smashed windows or windscreens can prove costly so it is important we take steps to prevent offenders stealing our property. I advise motorists to park in safe and secure car parks to try and avoid such a crime.'

The Blackfriars Partnership involves officers from GMP's Salford and North Manchester division, Salford and Manchester Councils, Greater Manchester Fire & Rescue Service, Greater Manchester Chamber of Commerce and NCP.

Crime prevention advice for Ordsall

Officers from Greater Manchester Police's Salford Division have been visiting every household on the Ordsall Estate to offer crime reduction advice and discuss the issues that affect residents on a daily basis.

Police from the Salford Central Neighbourhood Policing Team have also offered property marking free of charge, to help keep personal possessions safer from thieves.

Operation Neon coincides with a high profile awareness campaign, encouraging the public to get to know their local neighbourhood officers.



Inspector David Henthorne from Salford Central Neighbourhood Policing Team said:

"The aim of the initiative is not only to offer crime prevention advice and free property marking but

to engage with members of the community and find out what really matters to them. This gives residents the opportunity to tell us how they want their area policed as well as meeting members of the team."

"Our aim is to continue to work closely with the public so our Neighbourhood Policing Teams can help to improve the quality of life for everyone."
