New Team for Ordsall & Langworthy!

On 1st October a new team 'went live' in Ordsall and Langworthy. The team is called the Clean, Green, Safe Co-located Team and it will focus on environment and crime problems in the area.

Five new police constables will be in the team along with a new sergeant and three PCSOs. They will be joined by staff from Salix Homes and the Council's Environmental Services directorate.

The team leader is Deborah MacDonald from Salix Homes. Deborah said, 'The team is looking forward to tackling the concerns of local residents and to making Ordsall and Langworthy a safer and nicer place.'

The team will be based in Diamond House on Eccles New Road but will spend most of their time out in the local community dealing directly with local concerns about crime, anti-social behaviour and environment problems, such as fly-tipping and graffiti.

The Council's Neighbourhood Manager for Ordsall and Langworthy, Ross Spanner, said, 'We have developed partnership solutions to these problems over recent years but a team based together in this way, and of course the extra police officers, is a big development for the area and a chance to make a real difference.'

Illegal bonfires are illegal for a reason

In recent years, dangerous and illegal bonfires have become a problem in Salford. These bonfires are health hazards and sometimes result in secondary fires, personal accidents and damage to property.

In many cases, these bonfires are built with domestic and business waste, which attracts vermin such as rats. Illegal bonfires are also often too big or built too close to buildings, power cables, roads and other street scenery, which carries extreme risk to public safety and health.

Building on last year's success in reducing the number of illegal bonfires, Salford's Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership is determined to put a stop to this problem and its consequences. We will act on intelligence and resident reports to identify and dismantle dangerous bonfires at the earliest opportunity, we will prosecute fly tippers and

we will take action to address associated anti-social behaviour, such as the misuse of fireworks.

Salford's Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership strongly advises members of the public to enjoy bonfire night by attending one of the many organised events taking place in the area, such as Prince's Park in Irlam and Buile Hill Park off Eccles Old Road.

If you wish to report any fly tipping or illegal and dangerous bonfires, you can report it directly to Salford City Council on **0161 909 6500**. School kids marvel at new Litterbug comic

Children from an Ordsall primary school are using comic books to learn how to look after the environment.

St Joseph's RC Primary School is the first school to use the comic book adventures of Ordsall's famous Litterbug road sweeper and baddie Dino car, to educate children about the environment.

The comic book was designed by young people in Ordsall as part of last year's ECO (Environmentally Conscious Ordsall) week and will now be used to help children from other primary schools to understand why actions such as littering, graffiti and dog fouling are bad for the planet and how this can eventually impact on them.



Children will take part in one lesson per term, where they will get the chance to design their own adventure on their own story board.



The initiative is being delivered by the Council's Environmental Education team with support from; Ordsall Community Arts, LPC Living and the Community Committee. The comics have been developed as part of their commitment to engage with the Ordsall community and help improve environment in Ordsall & Langworthy.

Don't be a victim of domestic burglary

1 in 4 burglaries in Salford happen when doors and windows are open or unlocked.

What can I do?

- Be aware of this sort of crime – watch out for any suspicious behaviour in your neighbourhood
- Secure your valuables, ensure windows and doors are closed/locked when you go out -you may not be insured if doors and windows are left open or unlocked
- Report these crimes – phone 0161 872 5050 or in an emergency call 999
- Think you have seen something suspicious? Contact Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111

The thefts of metals affect everyone, together we can stamp it out!

Over recent years the value of metals such as lead, copper and iron has risen dramatically.

This has resulted in an increase in thefts of these materials, which criminals take from insufficiently protected sites and from other street based features such as manholes, grids and railings.

In addition to losing materials that are expensive to replace, the affected sites can suffer further structural damage caused by the forceful removal of these metals. This can cause fires and flooding which can spread to neighbouring premises, exposing residents to unnecessary health and safety hazards.

We can't fight this without you! Take a stand against crime

- **Be vigilant!:** Have you witnessed any suspicious behaviour? Have you noticed dubious 'workmen' operating in buildings in your area? Have you seen somebody carrying metals, possibly with the help of a wheelie bin? Could those metals be stolen?
- **Report it!:** All suspicious activities should be reported without delay to the police on **0161 872 5050**.

Urgent incidents requiring an immediate police response should be reported to **999**.

Alternatively you can contact 'Crimestoppers' anonymously to report any suspected criminals on **0800 555 111**.

GM Police have already made arrests following calls from residents in Ordsall & Langworthy.

- **Make it difficult for criminals!:** Ensure that ladders, wheelbarrows, wheelie bins and any other means of transporting stolen goods are locked away when not in use.
