The Seedley and Langworthy Trust celebrate lottery success to empower local residents

Residents across Salford are today celebrating the news that the Big Lottery Fund (BIG) will support the Seedley and Langworthy Trust to deliver a programme of activity focused towards improving lives.

The funding announced today is worth a total of just under £390,000 and was awarded through the Big Lottery Fund's Reaching Communities Programme.

Through the project, the Trust will be able to offer an open door Information, Advice and Guidance Service tailored around each clients specific needs. The project will empower residents to tackle a wide range of issues including local environmental concerns, financial exclusion and debt, welfare rights and housing issues. The project will increase opportunities for residents to access employment and training opportunities.

As well as delivering the project through its shop premises on Langworthy Road, the Trust will provide a holistic outreach service.

In addition to the above, the project will work with new and existing voluntary and community groups to improve community cohesion and increase opportunities for social interaction. A key part of the programme will be the recruitment of local volunteers including the setting up of a volunteer skills bank.

Gerry Stone, Chair of the Seedley and Langworthy Trust said; "As Chair of the Seedley and Langworthy Trust, I am tremendously grateful that the Big Lottery has provided funding to enable this fantastic project. It will ensure that many people from the City of Salford will benefit through its services".

Helen Bullough, Big Lottery Fund Head of Region for the North West said: "This project is an excellent example of how the Reaching Communities programme is enabling local organisations to provide huge benefits for people across the North West".

Vocational Education for Young People

COOL UK Salford opened its doors to the young people of Salford in September 2008. Our aim is to provide an informal yet inclusive approach to education and work based learning to engage young people facing difficulties at school. We currently run the following projects:

- Building and Construction
- Hair and Beauty

Not only do our young people gain hands-on practical experience, they achieve qualifications equal to GCSE's. Working closely with experienced tutors, they are able to receive support with their literacy and numeracy. By working in simulated working environments; they participate in real-life projects and gain valuable insight to their chosen vocation.

We are also developing a football project at Clarendon Fit City, which will be open to the entire community. We are looking at training young people to manage their own football leagues and gaining qualifications in event management and project development.

Dwayne, aged 17, comments:



"I think Cool UK is a good experience, I'm getting qualifications in health and safety and construction. I've built 3 sets of shelves, put 2 cupboards up, I've helped build a store

room, I've built a brick wall and plastered a wall, made some goalie nets and a tool box."

SNAP to it!

What do you think needs doing in Langworthy? That's what residents are being asked in the lead up to the Langworthy SNAP, which aims to clean up areas and target criminal activity over a week of action. Salford City Council is working together with the police, the fire service, local housing providers and the Probation Service's community payback team to address local issues.

In February the SNAP week was carried out in Winton and was a great success. An alleyway was gated, litter and graffiti was cleared from over 70 locations across Winton, 17.5 tonnes of bulky waste was collected and 235 homes were assessed for fire risks. And those are just some of the examples of what happened during the week!

SNAP will be running in Langworthy from Monday 27 April until Sunday 3 May.

It will:

- reduce opportunities for arson and anti-social behaviour by installing alley gates and making environmental improvements, including cutting back overgrown trees and removing graffiti
- help you to dispose of bulky waste with free collections
- reduce crime by working alongside the police and acting on local intelligence
- offer free forensic property marking kits
- make a positive contribution to the lives of children and young people through themed education programmes on topics such as drugs, alcohol, and diversity.

You should be able to feel proud of your area and safe in your surroundings. As someone who lives or works in Langworthy you know best what changes need to happen in your local area. So don't keep quiet about it! There's lots of ways to let the SNAP team know what you think should be included in the week.

New team is improving your neighbourhood!

Our winter 2008 edition introduced readers to the new Clean, Green, Safe Co-Located Team, a partnership between the people who are directly responsible for delivering services in Ordsall and Langworthy.



Since the launch in October 2008 the team have been very busy tackling crime, anti-social behaviour, litter and fly-tipping and generally improving the environment. Recent successes of the team include;

- With the provision of six extra police officers from the team to focus solely on Ordsall and Langworthy, the Police and Salix Homes have been successful in taking legal action against tenants for drug offences, nuisance and anti-social behaviour.
- Total crime has fallen by 20% within Ordsall and 4% in Langworthy in the last year to 31st December 2008, meaning that 523 less people have been the victims of crime!
- A big clean up day was organised at Gloucester Street, which resulted in 6 big skips being filled with 12 tonnes of bulk rubbish from resident's gardens and homes. Old and contaminated bins were also removed and extra cleaning and lighting repairs ordered.
- A list of priority sites has been created for maintenance and improvement across the neighbourhood, So far, James Street, Gloucester Street, South William Street, Stevenson Street and Islington Play Park have all been improved, creating a better environment in which to live and play.
- The team have two new mini-sweepers to help keep the streets clean and also a new "Man with a Van" to directly help tackle litter and fly-tipping.
