### Salford LIDS



As part of our work with Salford LIDS, local people are recording people's stories as part of the 'Re-tracing Salford' exhibition at Salford Museum and Art Gallery and now (in a shortened form) at Langworthy Cornerstone till mid August.

Lots of people whose homes were or are in Salford have visited and put their "blobs" on the old maps where they used to live and added to the family photos exhibited. It shows how many of the buildings in the central Salford areas have disappeared since the 1920s and has been said to be the one of the most visited museum exhibitions in the recent past.

We have recorded many stories and people say that they were good times despite the bugs, diphtheria and lack of food to eat. It also seemed to be normal to help each other out, from delivering babies to laying out the dead.

We play some of the stories at the exhibition including some we made for the 'Street of a Thousand Kids' at Salford Lads and Girls Club and some amazing ones from local residents.

We have been playing these interviews in our radio programme the Health, Heritage, and Happening Hour on Salford Community Radio 106.4FM.

We are running workshops with the artist Lawrence Cassidy most Thursday evenings 6.30pm till 8pm or contact: **0161 212 4420** for information. Everyone is welcome.

If you bring your family photos (preferably from the lost streets) Lawrence will mount them and put them in the exhibition. We will record your stories and put them on C.D and maybe radio. We are showing films made by families in the 50's and 60's and we will mark where you lived in the lost streets.

## Gateway Centre

It was a pleasure on Friday 9th May 2008 to attend the topping out session of the new Pendleton Gateway/LIFT Health Centre.

Along with members of the Pendleton Area Forum (who had had to put up with the majority of the disturbance) were local school children from St.Pauls CofE Primary School and St.James RC Primary School who had prepared a time capsule which will be buried in the grounds of the new centre.

The capsule will be opened in 30 years. One of the items placed in by the children from St.James was a plastic Tesco shopping bag. The reason for this is that a new Tesco is to be built on their current school site (the new school is being built on Lower Seedley Rd) and they believe that plastic bags will be extinct in 30 years. Let's hope they are right!

This new building will be located on Broadwalk, opposite Salford Shopping City in Pendleton.

## A Helping Hand for Key Workers



Local housebuilder, LPC Living, is giving a helping hand to key workers looking to buy their first home.

They've joined forces with the Government to offer the First-Time Buyer Initiative (FTBI) on a number of properties in their Hulton Square development opposite Ordsall Park.

Under the scheme a first-time buyer can take out a mortgage for a minimum of 50% of the purchase price of a property with the Government paying the rest. This means you could buy a two-bed apartment from only £59,500 (based on a 50% share of a property costing £119,000). Three-bed family townhouses are also available to buy from £75,000 for a 50% share.
