List of Schedule 1 Offences

The types of offences against children or young persons up to the age of 18 years, usually referred to as 'Schedule 1 Offences' are set out in Schedule 1 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1993. Briefly, they include:

- All forms of child abuse;
- Any form of sexual assault;
- All other forms of maltreatment including murder, manslaughter, infanticide, incest, violence, neglect or cruelty.

All full list of Schedule 1 Offences is set out below.

Common Law Offences.

The murder of a child or young person under 18 years.

Offences under the Offences Against the Person Act 1861

- S5 Manslaughter of a child or young person under 18 years.
S27 The abandonment or exposure of a child under two so as to endanger its life or health.
S43 Aggravated assault on a female child or young person under 18 years or on a male child under 14 years.
S56 (Repealed by S11 of the Child Abduction Act 1984) Taking away or detaining a child with intent to deprive a person having the lawful care or charge of such a child or the possession of such a child or receiving or harbouring a child with such intent knowing it to have been so taken away or detained.

Offences Under the Infant Life (Preservation) Act 1929

- S1 Cruelty to a person under 16 years.
S3 Allowing a person under 16 years to be in a brothel.
S4 Causing or allowing a person under 16 years to be used for begging.
S11 Exposing a child under 12 years to the risk of burning.
S23 Causing, procuring or allowing a person under 16 years to take part in a dangerous performance.

Offences Under the Infanticide Act 1938

- S1 Infanticide.

Offences Under the Sexual Offences Act 1956

- S2 Procurement of a female under 18 years by threats.
S3 Procurement of a female under 18 years by false pretences.
S4 Administering drugs to a female under 18 years to obtain or facilitate intercourse.
S5 Intercourse with a female under 13 years of age.
S6 Intercourse with a female between the ages of 13 years and 16 years.
S7 Intercourse with a mentally deficient female under the age of 18 years.
S10 Incest (or attempt to commit incest) by a man where the victim is under 18 years of age.
S11 Incest (or attempt to commit incest) by a woman where the victim is under 18 years of age.
S12 Buggery (or attempt to commit buggery) with a person under the age of 18 years.
S13 Indecency between males where one or both is under 18 years.
S14 Indecent assault on a female under 18 years of age.
S15 Indecent assault on a male under 18 years of age.
S16 Assault with intent to commit buggery.

- S19 Abduction of an unmarried female under 18 years from parent or guardian.
- S20 Abduction of an unmarried female under 16 years from parent or guardian.
- S22 Causing prostitution of female under 18 years of age.
- S23 Procurement of a female under the age of 18 years.
- S24 Detention of a female under 18 years of age in a brothel or other premises.
- S25 Permitting a female under 13 years of age to use premises for intercourse.
- S26 Permitting a female between 13 years and 16 years of age to use premises for intercourse.
- S28 Causing or encouraging prostitution of, intercourse with, or indecent assault on, a female under 16 years of age.

Offences Under the Indecency With Children Act 1960

- S1 Indecent conduct towards a child under 14 years of age.

Offences Under the Suicide Act 1961

- S2 Aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the suicide of a person under 18 years of age.

Offences Under Part 1 of the Child Abduction Act 1984

- S1 Abduction of a child by a parent;
- S2 Abduction of a child by other persons.

Offences Under the Protection of Children Act 1978

- S1 Taking, permitting to be taken, distributing or showing an indecent photograph of a person under 16 years of age; having such indecent photographs with a view to their being distributed or shown; publishing or causing to be published any advertisement likely to be understood as conveying that the advertiser distributes or shows such indecent photographs or intends to do so.

Offences Under the Child Abduction Act 1984

- S1 Taking or sending out of the United Kingdom a child under 16 years of age by a person connected with the child without the appropriate consent (abduction of child by a parent etc).
- S2 Without lawful authority or reasonable excuse, taking or detaining a child under the age of 16 so as to remove them from the unlawful control of any person entitled to lawful control of the child (abduction of child by other persons).
