## If you go down to the woods today...

Great things have been happening in the woods and it's all because of you.

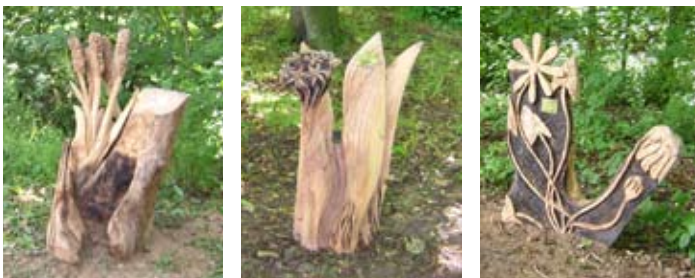


Not only large benefactors but 362 people have assisted our Worsley Woods Action Group and Rangers Annie Surtees and Jo Regan. Our Action Group was formed in 2005 and has undertaken continuous improvement to the woods ever since. Volunteers have worked 691 hours clearing the streams, hedge planting, fence repairs, and tidying. Its local nature reserve status for the 30 hectare Site of Biological Importance and its two priority habitats has brought considerable funding into the woods, firstly £10,000 of funding from the National Lottery Awards for All, and recently investment from Salford West Regeneration.

The investment has allowed the community group to carry out all the practical conservation work you see today with our support. The conservation volunteers have been meeting each month and the action group has been meeting every eight weeks to review and plan the work.

The hard work was recognised recently, on Sunday 15th June, when everyone was invited to see the new wildflower woodland trail running between Beesley Green and the site of the stepping stones as Kempnough Brook runs under the motorway. The ten sites of the woodland flowers are indicated by specially commissioned woodland sculptures in the shape of the plant. The Action Group had an information point on Beesley Green, The Magic Tree puppet show entertained the children and music was played meanwhile by the Eccles Borough Band.

Good news arrived of more finance to build a series of silt traps, which will assist in reducing the silting up of Old Warke Dam itself. Two examples of these can be



seen near the stepping stones and you can see the work in progress and a finished example. Annie Surtees told us that these would have a great impact on the water quality, the silt traps will be emptied each month by our staff teams and this will no longer be deposited into Old Warke Dam.

For the future £74,500 has arrived to pay for a play facility in the woods, made possible through a housing scheme completed a year ago. A condition placed on the scheme was for a children's play facility and our Community Committee felt that the Woods would be the most suitable location. The scheme has rugged woodland play facilities for young and old and carved benches will be up and running by the end of the year.

And now in the last few days, we hear Annie Surtees and her Ranger Team have been awarded £10,950 to work with the British Trust for Conservation Volunteers to create a boardwalk in the wet woodland.

Boothstown Residents Association joined forces with Boothstown Junior Football Club to hold the 20th anniversary running of the locally famous Boothstown Wobble as part of the Football Club's fun day. And the verdict was good, an enjoyable time was had by all. Also attending was national TV star Rebecca Atkinson seen here in our photo being photographed for the Salford Advertiser, with the winner of the junior girls' race.

The Wobble was an annual event for keen runners, fun runners as well as walkers and strollers, with the aim of achieving an Olympic ideal of everyone taking part was a winner.



It has brought together athletes from all over Manchester area as well as local people who just fancied a run with others one Sunday a year. In recent years the cost and enormous organisation that accompanies road races and traffic control has put the cost beyond our communities but a new route and new partners, The Bridgewater Canal Trust, had given a new look to the event.

One competitor told us, "It was just a wonderful course, I am local and I never knew how beautiful the country lanes and towpaths of the canal were, even though they just whisked by. I need to use this course for my weekend jogs." Another told us, "This has been an eye-opener for me, Boothstown has some lovely quiet lanes and byways and I was not aware of the size of the Football Club's facilities here." ## Don't Leave Them An Invite

Once again we're at that time of year when we can (hopefully) enjoy warmer weather and lighter evenings. Unfortunately this can often allow unwanted visitors into our homes. During periods of warm weather burglars often target homes. This is generally because of our understandable tendency to go out leaving windows open. Most burglars are opportunists, who roam a chosen area looking to exploit any opportunity to break into a house.

By following a few basic tips you can significantly help to reduce that opportunity. I would suggest these apply at all times when your home is unoccupied, even if you and your family are simply enjoying a BBQ in the back garden.

- Make sure you check the following when you leave your house.
- Close and lock all doors and windows (including upstairs windows)
- Remove any keys from door and window locks
- Don't leave any valuables such as car keys, wallets, purses, money, laptops and other valuables on open display.
- Lock the garage and or shed
- Put your power tools away in a secure cabinet and lock them in the garage or shed.
- If you know it's going to be dark before you return, consider setting timer switches so that your lights and TV come on.
- Set your house alarm. (Top tip, if you can, set your alarm for a downstairs zone at night while in bed)
- Tell a trusted neighbour that you're going out and what time you expect to be back.

### Additional tips for going on holiday

In addition to the above, if you're lucky enough to be getting away on holiday for a couple of weeks in the summer, you may want to think about these.

- Cancel your daily deliveries of newspapers and milk.
- Have a relative, friend or neighbour mow the lawn and water the plants.
- Similarly ask someone you know and trust to close and open your curtains.

Remember burglars look for anything that gives an indication your house is empty. By keeping up routines you may just deter them from visiting your home. Much of the above is common sense and most of you will already do it. But remember it's the basic things that can often save a lot of time, hassle, money and heartache.

**Keep it Safe, Keep it Hidden, Keep it Locked.**

## Anti Social Behaviour

Anti Social Behaviour can have a terrible affect on a community as well as individuals. Here in Worsley, Boothstown and Ellenbrook, we have worked hard over the last 3 years to significantly try and reduce occurrences of such behaviour. If you personally or your community is suffering from anti social behaviour, please inform us, without your information it can often be harder to find out about the issues affecting you. I have a number officers dedicated to dealing with anti social behaviour, but additionally the Local Partnership Delivery Group have an extensive array of resources we can call upon. We are keen to ensure that your quality of life is maintained and, that you don't have to put up with nuisance behaviour.

If you are a young person in the community who feels there is nothing to do, please come and talk to us, we want to hear about the things that you want and that will give you something to do. We can also put you in contact with people who already have activities going on in the area.

## Local community building in the running for environment award

A newly redeveloped community building in Worsley has been shortlisted for an Award at a prestigious national ceremony in London in October, which celebrates the achievements of the many diverse projects that have benefited from Biffaward funding in the previous year. The new Worship and Community Centre will compete with six others in the Buildings for Community and Culture category of the awards.

A £35,143 grant helped the Friends of Worsley Road United Reformed Church provide new community meeting spaces and storage areas as part of a wider programme of their redevelopment works. The Friends were keen to create a new centre, for worship and to satisfy increasing demand from the entire community. More than 150 volunteered their time, either by fundraising or managing the project.

The redeveloped Church Centre was opened in October 2007 and has been host to regular activities and one-off events ever since, including the "Bangladesh Medical Society in the UK" holding their Bengali Language day and three meetings of our Community Committee.

There is something for all ages to enjoy, from the pre-school 'Puddle Ducks' group, through to Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Rainbows Brownies and Guides onto 'Urban Stage', 'Healthy Hips' and the Senior Church Choir. Not forgetting the regular concerts, discos and the annual Pantomime. About 100 more local people are benefiting from the newly re-configured rooms and spaces created.

## Great News For Classical Music Lovers

For the first time Salford is hosting an open air concert with the BBC Philharmonic Orchestra and special guest Russell Watson, currently on tour throughout the UK. Many music lovers are familiar with open air summer music concerts, and now the largest ever ticketed event held in the city, "Proms in the Park in Salford", will take place in Buile Hill Park on 13 September starting at 7.30pm. So it is time to plan that picnic, find your favourite picnic rug, find your torch, and find your brolly (just in case).

There are 4000 special price tickets for Salford residents at £7.50, against the full price tickets are £20. Tickets will go on sale on Thursday 26 June, but you need to book early to get one of the five hundred special tickets reserved for those living in Worsley, Boothstown and Ellenbrook.

Made possible through the partnership between Salford City Council and the BBC Philharmonic Orchestra, this event cements the BBC Philharmonic as Salford's very own orchestra. In the first year of the partnership alone, Richard Wigley, General Manager of the BBC Philharmonic told us, the Orchestra has worked with more than 800 school children building great links with their schools and other groups in the area and played in nursing homes and churches.

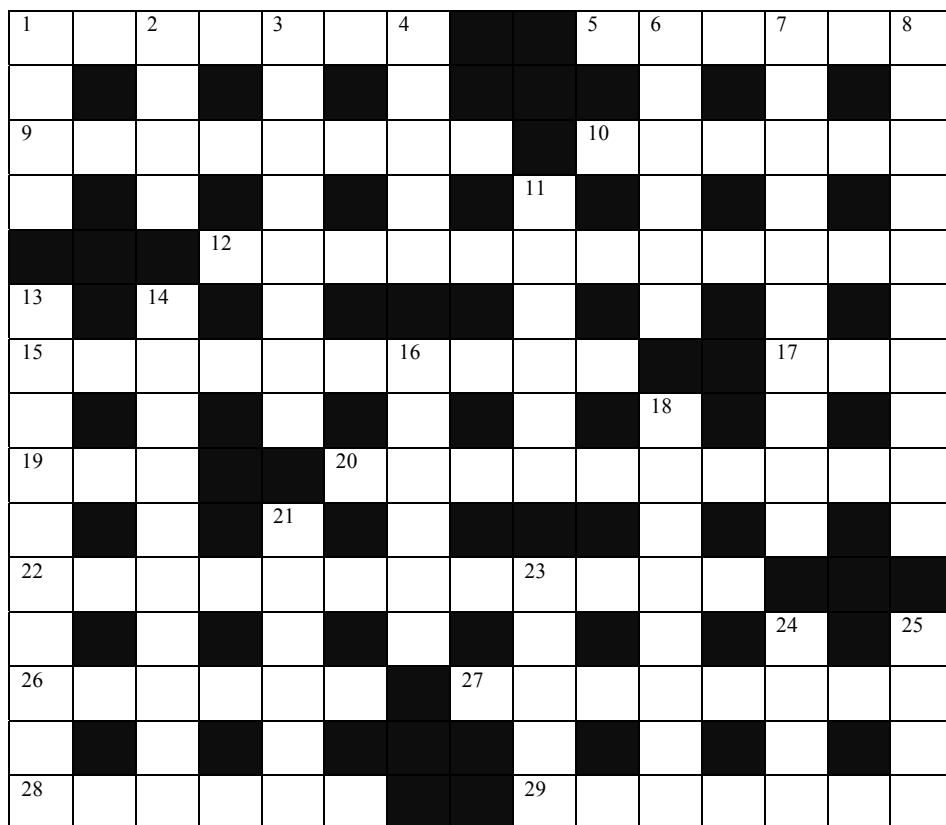

### Stilton and Onion Soup Serves 4

- 2 Large Onions, finely sliced
- 225g (8oz) Blue Stilton Cheese crumbled [More or less depending on taste]
- 40g (1½oz) Flour
- 25g (1oz) Butter
- 1 tbls Sunflower oil
- 1.5 litres (2 pints) Good Chicken Stock (For Vegetarians use Vegetable Stock)
- Salt and Ground Black Pepper
- To serve Single Cream

Heat the butter and oil in a large pan and gently fry the onions for about 10 minutes until soft but not brown. Add the Stilton and cook until cheese has melted, stir continuously to prevent cheese from sticking. Add flour and cook for a minute then gradually blend in the stock. Bring to the boil, stirring until thickened. Add seasoning, cover with a lid, turn down the heat and simmer gently for about 20 minutes. Taste and check seasoning then serve with a swirl of cream on top and chopped parsley if desired.

### School or Church Fair basic bun / cake mix

100grammes of caster sugar, 100 grammes of good margarine or vegetable fat. Mix well together.

Weigh 100grammes of self raising flour into a bowl. Add one egg and half the flour to the mix. Mix that well.

Add a second egg and the remaining flour mix that well. Add a generous dollop of vanilla essence. This reduces the sweetness of the mix and adds flavour.

Divide into 12 classic bun cases and cook until the tops are firm to a touch. You can scale this up easily. Five times quantities goes into a large mixing bowl and can produce nearly six dozen buns.

The mix also is a great one to sustain a massive fruit invasion; just try 70 to 100grammes of sultanas!

Time taken for five times quantity from ingredients to cooked buns less than 40 minutes.
