New Sure Start Children's Centres coming to Worsley, Boothstown and Ellenbrook

Sure Start is a national programme which aims to work with local families to give help, give all babies and young children the best start in education, health and social well-being. Two new children's centres are coming to Worsley, Boothstown and Ellenbrook and will be complementing existing services whilst also developing new ones in the area.

The centres will be places where children under five years and their families can receive integrated services and information, and where they can access help from multi-disciplinary teams of professionals, such as health visitors, family support workers and early educators.

The team currently includes the Children's Centre Manager Joan Parry, and Children Centre Workers:- Debbie Degenhardt and Sarah Jackson. We will be consulting with parents, carers and partners in the area over the next few weeks and we would like to hear from you what services for young children and families you would like to see in the area.

The Hidden Gem

Worsley possess a "hidden gem" which is celebrating its 225th anniversary this year. Worsley Methodist Church was founded in 1784 in the home of Mr. Burgess, the local miller. Services later moved to the Corn Mill at the bottom of Mill Brow before a chapel was opened on Barton Road in 1801. It has remained in the same spot ever since and is the oldest Methodist Church in the area.

The church is not standing still and values its community links. In the coming months the kitchen is to be refurbished and it is hoped to improve the entrance to the chapel. You can come and look around the chapel during the Worsley Festival on 1st and 2nd August when the church provides refreshments for the Boat Weekend. We will be open from 10-4 on Saturday and 12-4 on Sunday. You are also invited to attend the Service on the Green on Sunday 2nd August at 2pm. Do come along and visit the "Hidden Gem" and join in the celebrations of 225 years of Methodist witness in Worsley.

Boothstown Methodist Opening Service – Saturday 2 May 2009

The official opening service of Boothstown Methodist Service was held on the May 2nd and the building was opened by the UK leader of the Methodist Church - Rev Stephen Poxon who is the President of the Methodist Conference in the UK.

Around 30 years ago Mr Ken Fairfax led the congregation to set up a building fund to replace the existing building. The people of the Church took this further and have worked tirelessly to turn the vision into a reality. The vision has been to serve the community through providing space for community cohesion and activities and so plans for a multipurpose church and community building were developed. Wide consultation was undertaken and the need for extra community facilities identified.

The people of the Church have done brilliantly and have provided a facility that the community can be proud of and the Church can be proud of. The Church is also thankful for the support of the other Churches in Boothstown, our local Councillors, Worsley & Boothstown Community Committee, MP Barbara Keeley and the Manchester Evening News.

Most of the fundraising has taken place over the last 4 years.

Around 220K has been raised locally, through events, direct giving and bequests - the rest has come from grants from numerous sources.

Homewatch - Helping to Reduce Crime in your Area

Interested in setting up a Home Watch Scheme?

Anybody in a neighbourhood, however large or small can set up a Homewatch scheme. The more residents who want to get involved, the more successful a scheme will be. Not everyone in a street or neighbourhood needs to join a scheme, it will work as long as there are enough residents to keep an eye out for each other's properties and to liaise with the police. If you and your neighbours want to start a scheme, you may want to consider the following;

- Who will coordinate the scheme?
- Do you need a deputy coordinator?
- How will you communicate with members?
- How often will you meet and where?
